

#### **Challenges for Free and Fair Elections**

A democratic government means the rule of the people, by the people. Since in a big country with a huge population of billions, it is not possible for everybody to gather and rule each other. Hence, a system eventually came to be formed where a group of people would select one person to represent their interests. Through this person, the people's interests would rule. The basic challenges for organizing free and fair elections can be summed up by three initiatives like one person, one vote, a vote cast is a vote counted and voters must be protected from unlawful influences upon their decisions. The set of rules that governs the conduction of elections and referendums and how their results are determined is called an electoral system. The first goal is to ensure that every person with the right to vote (observing the legal requirements about citizenship, age, criminal convictions etc.) will be allowed to vote, and at the same time will cast only one vote. There are many ways to accomplish this, such as voter registration and some form of control of voter turnout, like collecting one's signature when casting a ballot. The process of prior registration usually results in some form of voter's database, which must be constantly updated with new citizens reaching the voting age, their currently assigned polling station, cancellation of entries for the deceased and so on. The database should be checked periodically to prevent duplication of records, and could be used to print a list of eligible voters for each polling station. The second initiative listed refers to the goal of properly counting all valid ballots cast during the election. Fall within this category all measures that must be taken to prevent frauds in the voting process, such as ballot stuffing, interfering with voting machines, destruction of valid ballots, frauds in the tabulation of results and others. Concerns about transparency and oversight must also be considered. The third goal is by far the most difficult to accomplish, involving a great deal of subjectivity. In theory, the political campaigns must be guided by rules defining its duration, types of ads allowed, limits of expenditure, origin of the resources and so on. The system adopted must include some way to resolve disputes arising from those issues.

#### Awareness program on "Internship Opportunities"

#### Logical Analysis on C language

Logic plays a fundamental role in Computer Science and is concerned with forms of reasoning. Since reasoning is involved in most intellectual activities, logic is relevant to a broad range of pursuits. The study of logic is essential for students of Computer Science. But having a good logical idea is not enough; students should be capable of converting the logic into good written programs. C Language is the main programming language supported by Apple for the macOS and iOS operating systems, and their respective application programming interfaces. Although numerous computer languages are used for writing computer applications, the computer programming language, C is the most popular language worldwide. Everything from microcontrollers to operating systems is written in Clanguage and understanding the logic in C programming is uncomplicated, since it's very flexible and versatile, allowing maximum control with minimal commands.

To improvise the logical thinking in programming, technical and Analytical skills in C Language, an assessment test was conducted on the theme 'Logical Analysis on C language' for MCA I, II & III year students. The assessment included Multiple choice questions and the students have to attempt 20 questions in 10 minutes. This enables the students to acquire a good insight on basic building blocks of C programming. Around one hundred and fifty students actively participated in the event.

#### Venezuela Economy



Have you heard about a country called Venezuela? It is a big country. Bigger than the Indian states of UP, Bihar, Punjab, Haryana, Bengal and Orissa combined. It consists 35 million, less than the population of Delhi NCR. God has given everything to Venezuela. In spite of having such fertile land and so much water, there is so much hunger in this country today that men have virtually turned into cannibals. There is nothing like farming of crops, fruits & vegetables, dairy, poultry, fishing, etc. in this country. Even if they can't grow wheat, rice, and vegetables for such a big country, there are grazing areas millions of hectares. Does Venezuela not even have a few cows, buffaloes, sheep and goats to graze and provide meat to its starving population? There is so much abundance of fish in the rivers

and ocean. Yet Venezuela is still starving. The situation of inflation has reached such levels that if you take a bag of Bolivar to a store, you will not get even a pocketful of bread. Inflation rate is 16,98, 488% compared to last year. Today you will get 3607 Venezuelan Bolivars in exchange for an Indian rupee. You may be surprised to know that Venezuela also has the largest crude oil reserves in the world, larger than Saudi Arabia. You would also be surprised to know that Venezuela was a developed and prosperous nation just 20 years ago, but the wrong policies of its leaders turned a prosperous nation into a beggar in just 20 years. Today the situation is so bad that many Venezuelan women have had to resort to prostitution for just a piece of bread. A good leader can turn his country into Singapore in 20 years and an incompetent leader can turn his country into a Venezuela.

After World War II, when there was tremendous demand for oil in the world and the prices were skyrocketing, Venezuela was having a gala time. In 1945, the country was making 1 million barrels of oil per day. The government started distributing free stuff to its citizens. Every service in the country was government provided and every service was free. In exchange for oil, goods came from all over the world; ration, cereals, fruits, vegetables, medicines, machinery and textiles, everything was imported in exchange for the oil, and the government gave its citizens everything free. In the 50's and 60's, when the whole world was working hard to increase manufacturing productivity, in Venezuela, not even a needle was produced. They even imported commodities like cabbage and tomatoes from Europe. Venezuela is a very beautiful country. Yet they don't have a tourism industry. Venezuelans were so hostile to tourists that if a tourist ever went there by mistake, it is said that nobody would offer him even a glass of water. Usually in such countries foreigners come from abroad looking of employment, but since there was free service in this country, all the parties and even the people of Venezuela were against the entry of foreigners into the country. Their thought was why foreigners should take advantage of our free service. The result was that the citizens did not do anything for a living, neither farming, nor any other industry, and the government did not let even labor to be imported from abroad to let industries develop. Therefore, there is no development in the country, even tourism. One day the price of crude oil started falling. The government owned Oil Company was PDVSA, and the government, typical of a communist government, told the company to give jobs to everyone. The company told that it does not need more employees. But the government insisted on it and gave at least one man of every family a job in the government oil company PDVSA where he did not do any work and took home a free, fat salary. Then the price of oil fell further and the oil company started incurring huge losses. As a result, providing free stuff to the population became impossible. Slowly every commodity became scarce. 35 million free loaders, who had not done any work in life, started looting. Girls got into prostitution. The socialist government still did not learn. It started taking loans to continue providing free stuff to its population.

Today Caracas, the capital of Venezuela, is the world's most unsafe city, where people slaughter, and girls sell their body for just a piece of bread. One plate food costs 1.5 million Bolivar. How can such a large country not even produce wheat rice for just 3.5 crore (35 million) people? Today if the Venezuelan government invites only 1000 farmers from India's Punjab and gives them the necessary machinery, then in just 6 months our farmers will produce more than enough grains, vegetables, fruits and milk to feed the entire country of Venezuela


